


CONNECTION**

When Glen relocated to our area, he was hoping for a fresh start. But the house he had planned to rent was unexpectedly sold out from under him. Then came **a cascade of hardship**: a serious shoulder injury, a car beyond repair, and no place to turn. Glen was homeless, in pain, and unsure how he would survive the coming weeks—let alone find a path forward.

That’s when he came to PorchLight.

The night Glen arrived - injured and exhausted - Bellevue was in the midst of the Bomb Cyclone. The shelter was taking in extra guests - keeping them out of the freezing temperatures and high winds.



Glen was met with warmth, safety, and a team ready to help. Staff sent him to the hospital to check his shoulder, then secured a hotel room nearby so he could continue healing. Once he returned to the shelter, the team drove him to medical appointments and helped him access the care he needed to begin his recovery.

Then he met Pablo. Their friendship became a lifeline. It is the kind of **connection that transforms** the recovery process - not just physically but emotionally.

Today, Glen is healing and hopeful. And thanks to you, PorchLight remains a place where **resilience is built** — and community is found.
